Finally we have our new website and readers love it. A little history: back in 1998, we launched a simple website. It all seemed scary and 'out there'. So that little site kept expanding as did The Club. In the past few months we have been working to create something not radically different but much snazzier with new features for you

1. Our blog. Blogs are essentially a way for members to talk to each other. There is a simple registration process, then you post your comment, question, photograph. You can chat about a specific trip, a travel concern, something you read relating to travel. You can post your photos to share with others on your trip. But do use it; we think you will find it a lot of fun.
2. The site is neat and easier to navigate. Each itinerary is print ready.
3. The members' section is re-divided and occasional discount coupons are hidden. There are FREE ads for your business, you are missing out on a no cost way to network with other members if you do not use it.
4. Our 'sites for women travelers' is greatly enhanced and we now post companies that have products we think you will want to know about.
5. All computers should be able to enter the site; before we did get complaints from some women who said they could not see it all. Again it is quite compact and efficient now.
6. On line payments: we can accept your payments via our on-line facility, provided by Wachovia Bank or by Pay Pal. Our Wachovia facility is easy to use and we are notified immediately if you deposit money in it, and as usual we contact you to confirm receipt of you \$\$\$.
7. Our booking form has been amended to reflect our new late booking fees: within 60 days of a trip, you will pay 5-8% more of the original trip cost.

So how can you have fun with the site? Send us your trip photos, we will post them! Send us diaries, we love to read them. Use the blog, especially if you want to chat with others on your trip beforehand. For non web-a-philes a blog means a web log!

On another theme, each year we donate to women's and girls' charities. Our funds in 2005 went to The Women's Fund of Miami Dade County, Connect (for homeless women in New York) and for Acadiana Outreach Center, for homeless women in New Orleans. Never been or been many times? Our Paris week is for all of you. We stay in elegant Concorde Ambassador Hotel, on the right bank near the Opera, and for 6 nights and 7 days we really get to know Paris. **April 20** Depart for Paris. **April 21** Transfer to our 4 star hotel, meet for welcome dinner in a restaurant. **April 22** Full day sightseeing from our private bus: the Eiffel Tower, Notre Dame and more. Lunch in a local restaurant included. **April 23** Half day Sightseeing in Le Marais, medieval section of Paris with lunch together in a local restaurant. **April 24** Half day tour of The Louvre, followed by a walking tour of the area. **April 25** Today we visit two elegant museums: Marmottan and Jacquemart Andre. The former is in a 19c mansion in the Bois de Bologne Park, full of Monet's works. The latter, is housed in a mansion open only since 1996 with a spectacular collection and original furnishings. Lunch in the lovely tea room. **April 26** Orsay Museum on the Left Bank, with the national collection of modern art, then a walking tour and lunch, Dinner tonight together before we start packing! **April 27** Transfer back to the airport and flights home.

Details available now- we already have bookings. You can do Provence first- these two trips coordinate with a savings of \$100 if you do both!!!

Price: \$1999. Single \$490. 60 days prior to April 20, price increases 5%. Deposit \$500. Airfare and portorage at the airport not included. A local host will be in attendance each am and a guide will be with you on sightseeing trips. .

The Silk Route: April 5-17 from Tashkent to Trans Oxiana to legendary Samarkand, Bukhara, walled Khiva and across the Amu Darya River to Turkmenistan. A trip of a lifetime! Price: \$2945 land + air via Moscow or Istanbul. I LOVED THIS TRIP when I went recently. Phyllis

The detailed itinerary is lengthy; we are summarizing here: **4/5:** Arrive Tashkent at the base of the Tien Shen Mts., Welcome dinner **4/6** Tour of Tashkent to include mosques and madrassahs, Independence Square, elegant Opera House, Museum of Applied Arts, and colorful bazaar & the studio of a ceramics master. Our hotel is across from the Opera house where events are available to tourists. **4/7** Off to Samarkand, famous Silk Rte Stop. Samarkand was conquered by Tamerlane, Alexander the Great and Genghis Khan! Our sightseeing includes The Registan the most majestic public square in the world, surrounded by blue tiled towers, mosques, fountains. **4/8** Today we continue in Samarkand, which Tamerlane decorated with superb tile work. We visit the observatory of Ulug Beg, the best in the medieval world, visit the excavation where a 7th c. Sogdian city sat, and stroll the colorful bazaar, dwarfed by a massive mosque. We see the mausoleum where Tamerlane is buried and wander the lane of tombs nearby. Tonight a cultural performance at a private home. **4/9** Depart for Shakrisabze, where we see the 14c White Palace ruins, we visit the local market and continue to Bukhara, on the trail of traders 100's of years ago. Arrive in Bukhara where we stay in a mansion of a Jewish Trader turned into a quaint B&B. **4/10** We begin our exploration of central Asia's oldest living city. Much is preserved; we visit the highlights: Lyab I Khaux Plaza, Kukeldash Madrassah, Kalon Mosque and Minaret. We stroll through the cap makers and spice bazaars, visit the citadel home of the Emirs of Bukhara who ruled for centuries. You will want to walk from our hotel to the street sellers who sell wonderful goods, some in ancient caravan inns. **4/11** Today is for the National Crafts Museum, palace of the last emir, and free time to wander the neighborhood in safety. People are friendly and mystified at tourists, Tonight a costume show and dinner in the tea-house of a local school **4/12** Off to Khiva a walled desert citadel, after a long drive thru the desert. **4/13** Khiva we visit it on foot- a preserved walled city with palaces of former khans and much more, **4/14** We cross into Turkmenistan and fly to Ashkabad, even the border crossing is exotic and unlike anything you have ever seen. **4/15** Ashkabad, capital of the strangest country on your list. We visit the various monuments but a highlight is the national museum and excellent carpet museum. Farewell dinner tonight. **4/16** Early start to Tolkuchka Oriental Bazaar, one of the most vibrant markets in Central Asia, bustling with tribes people and photo ops. The market meets weekly for those selling carpets, jewelry, silk, fabrics and animals. After lunch we visit the ruins of the Parthian kingdom of Nisa, at the foothills of the Kopetg Dag Mountains. Tonight free for packing/ and do bring an extra empty suitcase. **4/17** Depart for flights home.

This area is remote mysterious, formerly Soviet, today independent. Inclusive but for a few meals. Airfare via Moscow or Istanbul \$1600 + taxes. There are visas which our operator secures. Extensive orientation and a tour manager & local experts.

Note: from Phyllis, I tested this trip and consider it one of the best I have ever done, with surprises daily. Hotels were fine, food hearty, airplanes modern Boeings and our bus a Mercedes with a toilet. Meals were often in old palaces, old crypts or Turkish baths, some times in fascinating private homes. The guide kept us riveted all day by the strangeness and unusual make up of these areas. I did shop: caviar, 3 carpets from the museum, silk scarves 6 ft. wide, jewelry, and a fully embroidered robe. If ancient Jewish history is your thing, you need to go. If adventure is , you need to go. And if you want to learn about the lands where the Mongols once ruled and now King Oil does, you need to go.

What's coming up! Each year we add new trips and repeat favorites.



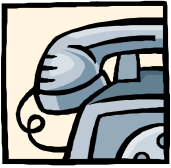
